#### TOWN CLERK'S UPDATE

Riverside Festival, Riverside Meadow – The Clerk advised organisers of the Riverside Festival asked if it can be held again this year in the middle of August. #### INFORMATION FROM MEMBERS

Cllr Lacey - noted the road markings at Rolls Mill Industrial Estate needed attention. Dorset Cllr Jones advised this was down to the management of Rolls Mill. Cllr Lacey had also received complaints about the number of people parking on Bath Road and asked that this be put on a future agenda. Cllr Donaldson – advised on several planning and tree matters. He had also been dealing with a lighting problem at Goughs Close and complaints about various potholes.

Cllr Reed - advised the 50mph sign at Rolls Mill had disappeared. The

Clerk will report to Highways.

Cllr Mantock: - enquired if there were any plans for a Coronation legacy? The Clerk suggested lighting in the Railway Gardens. It was also thought that suggestions could be sought from the schools. The Clerk asked Council for suggestions.

Cllr Fraser – noted potholes at the bridge had been filled.

Dorset Cllr Jones - requested the Council to research the process for creating a 20mph zone from the bridge to the traffic lights at Old Market Hill. This will be raised at the next Planning & Environment meeting.
