- He is progressing in talks to investigate the return of a Bank to Sturminster Newton.
- The Chamber of Commerce had a launch on 31st January 2019 5.30pm at The Bow Room. The Chamber now has 50 members and £4.5k has been made available from NDDC for a salary.
- Sturfit had received a £70,000 grant from NDDC for enhancements to the Leisure Centre.
- The Trailway Group has also received a grant.
