**25/26/304 Apologies for absence**

Apologies were received from Cllrs Dobson, Jackson, Lacey, Mantock and Trim. These apologies were accepted by members.

**25/26/305 To approve declarations of interest and written applications for dispensation**

No interests were declared and no written requests for dispensation received.

**25/26/306 To approve the minutes of the previous Town Council meeting held on 4<sup>th</sup> March 2026.**  
The minutes of the Town Council meeting held on 4<sup>th</sup> March 2026, having been circulated and published prior to the meeting, were taken as a true and correct record and duly signed by the Chair.

**25/26/307 To consider planning applications:**  
P/VOC/2026/01603 North Dorset Business Park, Rolls Mill Way – erection of 2 units for office/industrial use – variation of condition  
**No objection.**

P/FUL/2024/04736 Previously R B Snook Building Ltd – demolish existing buildings and erect 28 dwellings  
**Objection -non compliance with Policy 22 of the Sturminster Newton Neighbourhood Plan.**

**25/26/308 To consider entering into a lease agreement with the Sturminster Newton Allotment Association and agree further actions.**  
The Council considered a template lease agreement provided by the National Allotment Society. The Clerk advised that she was waiting for confirmation of responsibility for training and if it would be legally robust for the Sturminster Newton Allotment Association to apply for independent grants.  
**Subject to confirmation of these points, the Council resolved to enter into a lease agreement with the Sturminster Newton Allotment Association for both the Filbridge Rise and Chinnocks sites.**

- 25/26/309 To receive an update from the Grounds Manager regarding the Youth Facility project.**  
The Grounds Manager updated the Council on the Youth Facility project phase 2 in the Recreation Ground.  
A meeting had been held with interested parties – The Scouts, Boxing Club, Guides & Brownies and Youth Connect South West, who were all keen to proceed providing suitable space and facilities for each organisation will be incorporated into the plan.  
A pre-application has been submitted to Dorset Council Planning Department for a large two storey building to see what space is available before the organisations consider options and plans.  
The Town Council working group will meet when the response from Dorset Council has been received and will report back to Town Council on progress in due course.

**The Council resolved to have a stand for community engagement at the Big Lunch on the 6 June 2026.**  
Cllrs Cooper and Jackson will lead on the project and other members agreed to attend on the day.
- 25/26/312 To approve payments over £2000.**  
There were no payments over £2000 to approve.
- 25/26/313 To receive correspondence.**  
No correspondence had been received.
- 25/26/314 To receive a report from the Town Clerk.**
- The Clerk apologised that she had omitted to include recommendations from Committees on the agenda. Recommendation from the Planning & Environment and Amenities committees will be included on the next agenda.
  - She advised the access issues on the pavement at the bridge had been reported to Dorset Council. She suggested that in situations where emails are sent to all Councillors and Reception the Council may wish to decide on a unified response to save time and doubling up on work.
  - Finally, she reported the need to make some changes to meeting dates in April.

**25/26/315 To receive a report from the Town Mayor.**

The Mayor reported:

- 10th March I attended Twinning Association AGM
- 18th Meeting of the Thriving Communities Group, aiming to encourage and enable community groups to network and exchange information, and to be aware of opportunities to help each other.
- 21st With many others, I had the pleasure of listening to Sturminster Orchestra at their concert in the Exchange. An excellent performance of a wide variety of musical styles

**25/26/316 To receive information from members and proposals for future business.**

*Cllr Fraser* – informed members that The Exchange will shortly be able to show plays, ballets and operas from the National Theatre.

*Cllr Cooper* – is still trying to sort out the tree at Colber Bridge with Hinton St Mary estates. He is also meeting with the Graham Stanley from the Dorset Council Rangers next week.

*Cllr Batstone* – spoke about North Dorset Tourism Group and the focus on the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the death of Thomas Hardy. She also enquired about the Town Council communications strategy and getting external assistance with this.

*Cllr Donaldson* – had finally received a number of emails from Dorset Council in response to the pot holes he had reported. He also noted the damage to the Town Bridge at the weekend.

The accumulative deficit on the Higher Needs Block remains a concern. The Government has said they are looking to write off 90% but have not said what would happen going forwards, this is a serious concern that affects all councils across the country.

I have been chasing engineering solutions on both Rivers Corner and Chapel Road – both have been promised to ease future issues with flooding.

The new Chief Executive at Dorset Council is leading 'Transformation', my group's worry is that this is happening with little member involvement. There is currently consultation looking at whether scrutiny and overview should be one or two committees. We will be fighting hard to keep scrutiny separate. Currently Overview is chaired by the administration and Scrutiny is chaired by us in opposition – and our chairs are very robust and we feel very firmly that this should be a separate committee and we plan on doing everything possible to ensure we keep and manage scrutiny, it's important to ensure that policies made work, and work well for our residents.

The consultation on the change on the A357 to a 30mph stretch has finished. There are a number of residents who would like to extend this, but as the developer is paying for this – a future extension would need to perhaps be covered by Aldi.

Aldi has put in their planning application, but it has yet to be validated. I have asked whether the delay in their process will affect the store opening and am waiting to hear back.

I had a meeting with DAPTC last week which I believe will feed into the report to the TC. I would welcome a meeting between myself and all town councillors in order to look at how we can best work together going forwards.
